PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Winter has arrived, and the mornings are quite chilly! We are aware that various illnesses are spreading through the school. We kindly ask that you keep your children at home if they are unwell to help reduce the spread of illness and inform the school of their absence. If teachers are unwell, we endeavour to engage a relief teacher familiar to the students, or we may split the class to best support the students' needs.

Pupil Free Day

Last Friday (30th May), we held our pupil-free day for Term 2. SSO staff received support in reframing behaviour and assisting students with Autism. Teachers collaborated with Science of Learning Consultants to analyse class mathematics data and prepare number fluency interventions for their classrooms. These interventions will be implemented from Week 6.

Reconciliation Week

Our Aboriginal Education Team worked with teachers to develop a robust teaching program supporting this year's theme: "Bridging Now to Next." Students also engaged with Violet from Winda Creations, who nurtured cultural understanding and instilled a deep sense of connection through arts, crafts, and storytelling. Her aim was to guide the community to truly understand the land we walk upon, to know its history, and to honour the custodians of this ancient country.

Facilities

The installation of the sound system in our gym is nearly complete and is on track to be ready for our Week 8 assembly.

Friday 23rd May






IXL Mathematics

To get started, you can request a login card from your child's teacher, which will provide access to the site.
